Her publications include *Changing Cultures: Feminism, Youth and Consumerism* (1992); *Modern Times: Reflections on a Century of English Modernity* (1996); and *Visceral Cosmopolitanism: Gender, Culture and the Normalisation of Difference* (2007). She is currently doing research on race relations social investigators in UK in the postwar period.

SEMINAR (2 SST.)

In this course students will create a project on an aspect of Vienna in a format of their choice. Projects should be accompanied by written commentaries of 1,000–2,000 words in which students reflect on their thematic concerns and the effectivity and constraints of their selected practice.
